# RE: PAEDIATRIC DENTAL SERVICES (COMMUNITY DENTAL SERVICES; CDS) – NEW ARRANGEMENTS EFFECTIVE FROM 3<sup>RD</sup> APRIL 2017

As you will be aware Community Dental Services' (CDS) were procured, London wide, during the summer of 2016 and contracts were subsequently awarded to new providers and will come into effect on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> April 2017.

The basis for the procurement has been to deliver a single specification for Paediatric Dental Services across London, thus eliminating the inequities in care provision that currently exist. A key component of the specification is that new providers will act as the 'gate-keeper' in respect of all Paediatric referrals, with a few exceptions, sent by GDPs. The rationale for this is to provide the right care to the right patient in the right place. The referral and triage process is detailed below.

#### PROCESS/ PATIENT PATHWAY

GDP	•Step 1 – All Paediatric referrals to be sent tto CDS for initial triage
CDS	• Step 2 – CDS will treat where appropriate
ACUTE	•Step 3 – CDS will refer to secondary care when appropriate

## HOW TO REFER TO THE SERVICE

Attached to this document is a standard referral form, (please refer to the appendices).

The form should then be sent to the most appropriate CDS central referral office, details of which can be found below and further clinic details in the appendices. The referral will be triaged and the four possible outcomes are

- a) Appointment in the CDS
- b) Onward referral to the acute secondary care sector
- c) Returned as unsuitable
- d) Returned as lack of information.

### CAN I REFER DIRECTLY TO PAEDIATRIC CONSUTLANT LEAD SECONDARY CARE SERVICES?

Yes, in the case of:

- a) Suspected cancer only
- b) Acute dento-alveolar trauma (48 hours old)
- c) Acute facial sepsis

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

## Q: What is the cut off age for paediatrics?

A: 15 years and younger, patients between 16-18 year should be referred on the adult SCD referral form.

### Q: Can patients self-refer themselves to CDS?

A: No, the referral must be made by a health professional.

## Q: Who is carrying out the triaging?

A: The initial triage will be carried out by a member of the clinical team within the relevant CDS provider

### Q: When does the 18 week Referral to Treatment (RTT) start?

A: The 18 week RTT clock starts when a referral is received by an acute provider. CDS providers are not subject to national RTT guidance.



### Q: What are the discharge processes?

A: Patients with paediatric needs which meet the criteria for moderate complexity or above will remain in either the CDS or secondary care service and are recalled according to NICE guidelines.

Patients without complex paediatric needs are discharged after one course of treatment back to general practice.

- Acutely swollen face/systemically unwell
- Dental/facial trauma requiring urgent specialist management
- Uncontrolled dental haemorrhage
- Suspected oral malignancy
