



Neurofibromatosis type 2 transition information

This leaflet explains more about the transition process offered in the neurofibromatosis (NF) service. If you have any further questions, please speak to a doctor or nurse caring for you.

What is the transition process?

The transition process is an important in a person's life. It is a time for planning and looking to the future. For people with neurofibromatosis type 2, it is important to ensure that you are involved, prepared and understand the changes. During this time you will gradually have your care moved from the paediatric clinics to the adult clinics within the neurofibromatosis team.

When does transition start?

From the age of 14, the paediatric team will help you to prepare for the transition process. They will do this by supporting you in setting some helpful goals that you can aim to achieve by the time you reach 16 years. During each clinic visit, the aim will be to set new goals with support from the clinical nurse specialist so that you can become more independent.

Where?

The paediatric and adult clinics are both based in the neurofibromatosis department at Guy's Hospital. The paediatric and adult clinics may be on different days. The transition clinics happen alongside the paediatric clinics and you will have the opportunity to meet others of similar ages who also have neurofibromatosis.

Who will I see?

During your transition appointments you will see your paediatric NF doctor and clinical nurse specialist. You will also have the opportunity to meet with the adult clinical nurse specialist.

What will I do?

The plan of the transition process is to support you in setting up goals to become more independent in managing your neurofibromatosis. The clinical nurse specialist will support you in setting these goals with you and your parents.

It is helpful if you can think of some goals before you attend the clinic and a list of any questions you would like to ask us. You will also have the opportunity to see us on your own and then your parents can join the consultation afterwards.
