



What is pre-assessment and why is it important?

This leaflet explains what pre-assessment is and why it is important for your child to have a pre-assessment before their operation, procedure or planned test.

What is a Pre-assessment Clinic?

If your child needs to have an operation, or any planned test involving a general anaesthetic, you will be asked to attend a Pre-assessment Clinic.

Why is it important that your child attends?

At the Pre-assessment Clinic we make sure your child is well enough to have a general anaesthetic.

If your child has not had a pre-assessment check before the date of their operation, planned test or procedure, your child's admission may have to be delayed until a pre-assessment has been done.

What happens during the appointment?

A specialist nurse or nursing assistant will check your child's medical history, take their blood pressure, pulse, temperature and oxygen levels as well as measure their height and weight. They will also take swabs; this is routine and checks for any infections that might affect your child's operation, planned test or procedure.

Your child may need additional tests. These tests may include:

- blood tests
- ECG (electrocardiogram measures the electrical activity of the heart)
- x-rays

If your child needs any of these tests and it isn't possible to do them on the day of your preassessment, we will arrange for them to be done before your child's stay in hospital.


